



COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM GUIDELINES

The Community Advisory Panel (CAP) of Corteva Agriscience - Pittsburg Operations has established a competitive community grant program to fund sustainable community service projects in Eastern Contra Costa County. The competitive grant program is designed to address specific community needs, solve problems or improve the quality of life for residents. Projects must impact a minimum of 50 people; projects impacting a large percent of the community will be viewed favorably.

COVID-19: Projects should meet current social distancing guidelines.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

To qualify for Corteva's Community Grant Program, organizations must be a 501(c)(3) non-profit, municipal, or government agency or school. Only one application per project may be submitted. Grants will be awarded up to \$5,000, depending on the scope of the project. Incomplete applications will be disqualified. The selection of projects and oversight of this funding is administered by the Corteva CAP.

Grants cannot be given to individuals, capital campaigns, travel expenses, political campaigns, individual scholarships, golf outings, sectarian or religious organizations for projects that serve only its own members or adherents, disease specific organizations, or organizations that discriminate based on gender, race, religion, sexual orientation or nationality.

PROJECT EXAMPLES

Corteva seeks projects that improve the environment, support hands-on science and math learning, and contribute to the community's success in the areas of educational opportunities and environmental protection. Project examples include restoring wildlife or recreation areas; expanding educational opportunities for students of all ages or their teachers, especially in the areas of science and math; and workforce development programs for local students. Projects with an emphasis on visible improvements and long-lasting results will be the most competitive in the selection process. *Capital, maintenance, structural, or systems improvement projects will not be considered.*
